

# FBCH Youth Camp Information 2010

## MEDICATION:

All prescribed medication and over-the-counter medicine must be kept in the Mt. Lebanon Health Center, and administered by the health center staff.

- Prescription medication must be in its pharmacy labeled bottle
- Over-the-counter medicine must be in its original package
- NO LOOSE PILLS WILL BE ACCEPTED

## ATTENDANCE:

All campers are required to attend all worship services. Campers are required to participate in all scheduled events. Campers are not to be left alone in buildings. If you have a sick camper, we will need to take that camper to the health center for care.

## NEEDING TO LEAVE CAMP EARLY OR FOR AN APPOINTMENT:

If a camper needs to leave camp early or if they have an appointment they need to leave and come back for, you will do this down in the health center. The health center has forms for the Shepherd or parent to fill out. Parents will pick-up and drop-off campers at the health center.

## SENDING A CAMPER HOME (DISCIPLINARY REASONS):

Campers can be sent home anytime for breaking camp rules or for discipline reasons. **This will be at the parents' expense.** The process for sending a camper home is contacting the Camp Dean or Camp Sheriff, and taking that camper to the health center and to fill out the paperwork. A church representative will need to stay with the camper until the parent or guardian picks up the camper. **By sending your child to camp, you agree to provide for their way home in the event of disciplinary action.**

## VISITORS POLICY:

The church will need to provide a list of AUTHORIZED visitors at Sunday registration. Visitors will be issued a pass at the security gate and will be asked to park at the health center. A church Shepherd should meet them there, so they were be able to escort them to the area your group is in. UNATHORIZED visitors will not be let in. If a guest shows up at the security gate, and is not on the list, they will be asked to pull over until we can get a hold of the Lead Shepherd to get authorization. **Contact Matt or Rachel before we leave on Sunday if you want to visit.**

## VEHICLES ON CAMP:

Vehicles must remain parked while at camp and will be issued a parking pass at registration. Churches are not allowed to drive campers to and from events. When coming and going from camp, vehicles must drive 10 mph hour through the camp. This is due to campers walking, and golf carts driving around. Please secure your vehicles during. The camp is not responsible for loss or damage to your vehicle.

## DEPARTURE TIME:

We will **leave** FBC Hebron at 2:00pm on Sunday, July 25.

## FOOTWEAR:

- Closed Toe Shoes must be worn on campgrounds at all times.
- Flip-flops can only be worn back and forth between the pools and lodging (there is plenty of Poison Ivy)
- To participate in any of the recreation activities, campers must wear shoes that completely cover the foot. No open toe shoes are allowed.

## **DRESS CODE:**

### Girls

- No undergarments or midsections showing
- Clothing designed as underclothing may not be worn in public
- No short shorts or mini-skirts
- No clothing with inappropriate symbols or messages on it
- No halter tops, tub tops, bare midriff tops, or spaghetti strap tops. Tank tops can be worn, but they must have a 2 inch strap.
- Only modest 1 piece bathing suits and tankini style suits can be worn at camp. Camp lifeguards may use their discretion in regards to questionable camper swimwear. Campers could be asked to wear a dark color t-shirt if the suit is deemed inappropriate.
- When walking back and forth from the pool and lodging, all swimmers must wear a long t-shirt or cover.
- Jeans and shorts can be worn to worship services

## **DRESS CODE:**

### Boys

- Shirts must be worn at all time, unless swimming.
- No cut-off shorts
- Pants and shorts must be worn at the waist. No sagging pants or shorts are permitted.
- Under garments can be visible.
- No clothing with inappropriate symbols or messages on it
- No speedo swimwear
- When walking back and forth from the pool and lodging, all swimmers must wear a long t-shirt or cover.

## **WHAT TO BRING:**

- Linens, blanket, pillow or sleeping bag for a twin size bunk bed
- Towels for bathing and swimming
- Toiletries (toothbrush, paste, shampoo, soap)
- Shower shoes
- Laundry bag
- Hats and sun visors
- Sunglasses
- Flashlight
- Sun block
- Water bottle – VERY IMPORTANT!!!
- Bible, notebook, pens, pencils
- Money for snacks and souvenirs
- Separate money for lunch on the way home Friday.

## **WHAT NOT TO BRING:**

- Alcohol, tobacco products, illegal drugs
- Firearms, fireworks, lighters, or matches (including airsoft, paintball, and bb guns)
- Water guns or water balloons
- Skateboards, rollerblades, roller skates
- Electronic items – youth should NOT have cell phones, tv's, laptops, video games, radios, laser pointers, or mp3 players. (Cameras are okay, but not camera/mp3 or camera phones!) You can talk to your parents when you get home!
- Bad Attitude
